- b. Richland County, the Conservation Commission, and the Recreation Commission pursue purchasing all properties associated with Caughman Creek using Hospitality Tax funds for recreational,

- c. To perform a Cost-Benefits Analysis of all companies that receives "fee-in-lieu-of-taxes" and develop other models of tax abatement, that will optimize the best results for Richland County when recruiting and retaining companies without the county taking indirect long-term burdens (i.e. environmental, infrastructure and economic) that is presently not being calculated. - e. To direct Public Works to review County ordinances and propose amendments that would allow the recovery of cost to repair damage done to County public roads. The intent of this motion is to hold those responsible who damage the roadways due to the use of heavy vehicles, improperly prepared property entrances or other uses for which the types of roadway was not intended. [Malinowski] This item was forwarded to the April D&S Committee. ACTION:

- f. Remove the wording that employees are prohibited from possession of a weapon on county property and change it to allow possession of a weapon in a locked trunk only or other receptacle if a trunk is not available. This will not authorize possession in any building, only the vehicles. [After discussion, the motion was amended to also include Council Members.] [Malinowski] This item was forwarded to the April D&S Committee. ACTION: ADMINISTRATION, HUMAN RESOURCES
