Set-off Debt/GEAR Debt Write-Off – Mr. Manning moved, seconded by Ms. Dickerson, to forward to Council with a recommendation to approve the write-off of all Emergency Medical Services (EMS) debts which are currently ten years old and any future requests to dispose of debt would be presented to Council for consideration. The vote in favor was unanimous.

Property Acquisition Assistance – Mr. Livingston moved, seconded by Mr. Manning, to forward to Council with a recommendation to approve the use of \$40,311.70 from the Planning Department's Neighborhood Improvement Program's budget to assist the Community Assistance Provider, Inc. (CAP) in acquiring the property located at 6319 Shakespeare Road, Columbia, SC 29223. This acquisition will allow site control by the non-profit group (CAP) for redevelopment of the parcel of land into affordable housing to benefit the surrounding areas of Trenholm Acres and New Castle Neighborhoods, lien settlement, option payments and paid annual taxes by CAP, Inc. Subject: <u>Budget Amendment – Public Works Road Maintenance Fund Balance to help fund the Low Volume Paving Program</u>

A. Purpose

County Council is requested to approve a budget amendment from the Public Works Road Maintenance Fund Balance in the amount of \$900,000.00 to assist in funding the Low Volume Paving Program (Program).

B. Background / Discussion

On February 17, 2009, County Council approved an ordinance amendment to the County's Code of Ordinances (Section 21-3 and Section 21-20), creating an alternative dirt road paving program and adopting countywide dirt road paving program standards.

The ordinance amendment reduced the cross section width and pavement thicknesses on dirt roads that qualified for the Program, and allowed the County to pave more miles of road for less money.

The County's Public Works Department approached the CTC (Richland County Transportation Committee) for funding for paving low volume roads. The CTC allocated \$4,000,000.00 to the County for the Program. The County agreed to supplement that funding with an additional \$900,000.00. An engineering consultant developed a Low Volume Paving Manual, which served as the basis for the program.

At the November 1, 2011 Council meeting, Council approved the Program. To date, we have paved approximately forty (40) roads through the program, using funding from the abovementioned funds allocated by the CTC and funds provided through the County's Transportation Penny Program.

County Council approved the use of \$900,000.00 from the Road Maintenance Fund Balance; however, the funding was never allocated. At this time, we are requesting a budget amendment in the amount of \$900,000.00 to assist in funding the program.

C. Legislative / Chronological History

- 2/17/09 County Council approved the an ordinance amendment to the County's Code of Ordinances (Section 21-3 and Section 21-20), creating an alternative dirt road paving program and adopting Countywide dirt road paving program standards.
- 11/1/11 Council approved the Low Volume Paving Program.

D. Financial Impact

A budget amendment in the amount of \$900,000.00 is needed to supplement this Program to pave low volume roads in Richland County. The requested funds are available in the Road Maintenance Fund Balance. This action will require three (3) readings and a public hearing.

E. Alternatives

- 1. Approve the request for a budget amendment from the Public Works Road Maintenance Fund Balance in the amount of \$900,000.00 to supplement the Low Volume Paving Program.
- 2. Do not approve the request for a budget amendment from the Public Works Road Maintenance Fund Balance in the amount of \$900,000.00 to supplement the Low Volume Paving Program.

Subject: Purple Heart COMET Bus

A. Purpose

Council is requested to approve \$3,000 (\$1,000 annually) to wrap a COMET bus for 3 years to recognize Purple Heart recipients.

B. Background / Discussion

This request came from a constituent, Bill Dukes, on behalf of the Purple Heart Association of the Midlands. Lexington County and the City of Columbia are also being approached by Mr. Dukes to participate in this request. While this is not a Military Task Force initiative, per Mr. Dukes, it is a great opportunity for the greater community to show that we are a military friendly community.

Mr. Dukes met with Bob Schneider, Executive Director of the COMET, who, per Mr. Dukes, is supportive of the Purple Heart Bus. If this concept is approved, the COMET will receive a discount on the wrapping from the business owner who wraps the COMET buses. A proposed concept is attached for your convenience.

The COMET would rotate this bus on its routes so that all communities can experience the Purple Heart Bus. The wrap would remain on the bus for 3 years. Per Mr. Dukes, the COMET Board should vote soon to relieve the Purple Heart Association from the monthly marketing fees associated with the wrap, which will also be a significant savings.

Mr. Dukes feels that the Purple Heart Bus will be a great addition for the Army's Listening Session visit on February 26, 2015 as the Army assesses the economic impact of reducing jobs and potentially downsizing Ft. Jackson. Per Mr. Dukes, the Army has made it known that they only want to be located in communities that "love the Army."

The goal is for the Purple Heart Association of the Midlands to present the bus to the community prior to the February 26, 2015 Listening Session. The Purple Heart Association also plans to have a press conference to announce the idea once it is determined who will sponsor the bus.

Lexington County nor the City of Columbia have approved participating in this request as of January 21, 2015. Staff's recommendation is that our participation be contingent upon that of the City of Columbia and Lexington County.

C. Legislative / Chronological History

This request was generated by a constituent, Bill Dukes.

D. Financial Impact

The County's financial impact for 3 years would be \$3,000 (\$1,000 annually). This assumes equal participation by the City of Columbia and Lexington County. Currently, a funding source is not identified.

Council may choose to fund this initiative for 1 (\$1,000), 2 (\$2,000), or 3 (\$3,000) years, or some other amount, or not at all.

E. Alternatives

- 1. Approve the request to provide \$3,000 (\$1,000 annually) to wrap a COMET bus for 3 years to recognize Purple Heart recipients. A funding source would need to be identified. Again, staff's recommendation is that our participation be contingent upon that of the City of Columbia and Lexington County.
- 2. Approve the request to provide another amount to wrap a COMET bus to recognize Purple Heart recipients. Based on the amount provided, the number of year(s) would correlate. A funding source would need to be identified. Again, staff's recommendation is that our participation be contingent upon that of the City of Columbia and Lexington County.
- 3. Do not approve this request in any amount at this time.

F. Recommendation

While this is a policy decision of Council, it is staff's recommendation that Richland County's participation be contingent upon that of the City of Columbia and Lexington County.
